Freedom of information application

I refer to your application to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet (DPC) under DPC Circular PC031, 'Freedom of Information Release of Cabinet Documents under the Ten Year Rule', seeking access to:

One document was identified as answering the terms of your application and I have determined to refuse this document in full.

This documents contains information concerning the commercial and financial affairs of both Adelaide Airport Ltd and Tiger Airways, information which is of a commercial value to both entities. The disclosure of this information could reasonably be expected to destroy or diminish the commercial value of the information, and impact on Adelaide Airport's relation with both current and prospective airlines.

The disclosure of this information may alter the commercial position of airlines with dealings with Adelaide Airport and, on balance, would be contrary to the public interest. The disclosure could have a detrimental impact on airport and airline relationship, which would then have a negative impact on the travelling public and the ability to attract new airlines with South Australia. Adelaide Airport works closely with the State Government to attract new airlines to the State and where information of this nature would be made public, it would certainly prejudice the future supply of information by Adelaide Airport Ltd to Government. It is for these reasons I refuse access to this document in full pursuant to clause 7(1)(c) of Schedule 1 to the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act).

Clause 7 – Documents affecting business affairs

(1) *A document is an exempt document—*

...

(c) *if it contains matter—*

(i) *consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and*

(ii) *the disclosure of which—*

(A) *could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and*

(B) *would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.*


Right to internal review

If you are aggrieved with this determination, you have a right to apply for internal review under subsection 29(1) of the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act). Pursuant to subsection 29(2) of the Act, your application must:

- be in writing
- be addressed to the principal officer, and
- be lodged at an office of DPC, or emailed to DPCFOIUnit@dpc.sa.gov.au within 30 days after the day on which you receive this letter or within such further time as the principal officer of DPC may allow.
