Objective

To drive the Government's objective to make Adelaide a more vibrant city, and ensure successful achievement of interlinked planning, transport and land use and other reforms, to support Adelaide to be a thriving city with a strong national and global reputation.

It is intended that other members may be added from time to time, as Cabinet, the EDCC or the Taskforce see fit.

Members of the Taskforce may appoint an appropriate delegate to attend in periods of absence.

Terms of reference

The Taskforce will meet its objective by:

- Ensuring progress on the Government's new initiatives to make Adelaide CBD carbon neutral;
- Taking lead responsibility for meeting the objectives and targets within Economic Priority 8: 'Adelaide: the heart of a vibrant city', and for the Chair to

report to the Economic Development Cabinet Committee on progress as required by that Committee;

- Where necessary, ensuring that existing work underway set out under the 'Creating a vibrant city' South Australia Strategic Priority continue to meet targets set forth;
- Identifying future priority areas or new strategies to promote Adelaide as a vibrant city locally, nationally and globally;
- Oversight and encouragement of engagement with the South Australian community to facilitate a conversation on improving the vibrancy and liveability of the city; and
- Considering any other related matters referred to it by Cabinet, or the EDCC.

Operational matters

Meetings

The Taskforce will meet at least 4 times per annum, or more frequently at the discretion of the Chair.

Secretariat

The secretariat function supporting the Taskforce will be provided by Renewal SA.
