
POPULATION ESTIMATES JUNE QUARTER 2015

Summary

- During the year to June 2015, South Australia's Estimated Resident Population (ERP) increased 0.8% (or 13,100 persons) to 1,698,600 people.
- Nationally, the ERP increased by 1.4% to 23,781,200 people.

Further Analysis

South Australia's population rose by 0.1% during the June quarter 2015, to be 0.8% higher than a year ago. Nationally, population rose by 0.3% in the June quarter 2015 and was 1.4% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 1.



Population growth over the year by state, from highest to lowest was: Victoria (1.7%), New South Wales and the ACT (both up by 1.4%), Western Australia (1.3%), Queensland (1.2%), South Australia (0.8%), and Tasmania and the Northern Territory (both up by 0.4%).

In the 12 months to June 2015 the largest contribution to South Australia's population growth came from net overseas migration, which totalled 10,400 persons, but was down 5.1% from the previous 12 months. Natural increase over the period totalled 6,400, down 10% from the previous 12 months. In the year to June 2015, there was a <u>net</u> interstate outflow of 3,800 people from South Australia, 27% higher than in the previous 12 months—see Chart 2.
