ABS BUILDING APPROVALS, JULY 2016

Summary

During July 2016, the number of new dwellings approved:

- fell by 1.8% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals rose 0.2%); and
- fell by 16% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (nationally, new dwelling approvals rose 11%).

Further Analysis

Trend data


The total number of dwelling approvals in South Australia in July 2016 was 13% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the number of dwelling approvals was 0.9% higher than a year ago – see Chart 1 and Table 1.

The number of <u>private sector houses</u> approved for construction in South Australia fell by 1.6% during July to be 2.9% higher than a year ago — see Chart 2.


Private 'other' dwelling approvals in South Australia fell by 1.1% during July but was 42% higher than a year earlier.






Nationally, the number of private sector houses approved for construction fell by 0.5% during July, while the number of private 'other' dwelling approvals rose by 0.9%.



The value of renovation approvals in South Australia rose by 2.2% during July and was 18% higher than a year ago. Nationally, the value of renovation approvals fell 0.3% in July but was unchanged from a year earlier—see Chart 3.





During July, the value of non-residential building approvals was unchanged in South Australia but was 13% higher than a year earlier. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals rose by 3.9% during July, to be 19% higher than a year ago—see Chart 4.

Note: The ABS excludes large irregular movements in a seasonally adjusted series when calculating a trend series. This is pertinent in this brief where seasonally adjusted private sector 'other dwellings' has recorded large irregular movements in South Australia, and explains why there is a large difference in the movement of these series.
