

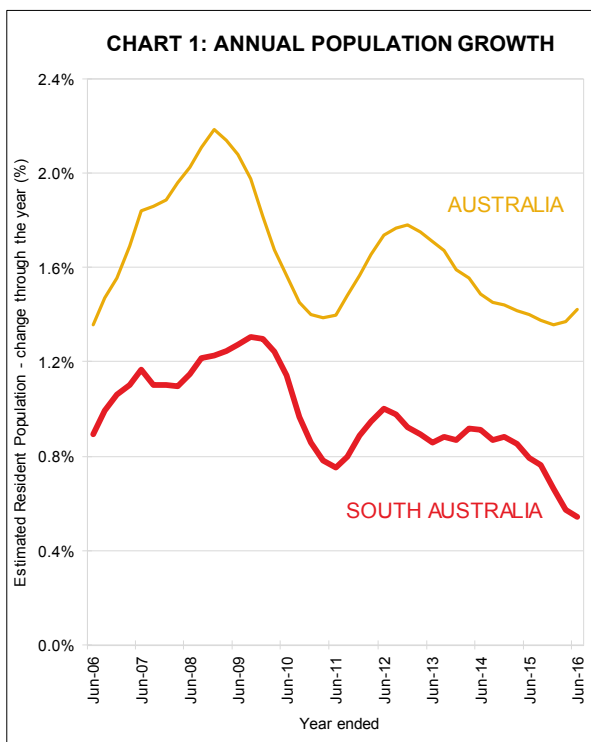
# POPULATION ESTIMATES, JUNE QUARTER 2016

## Summary

- During the year to June 2016, South Australia's Estimated Resident Population (ERP) increased 0.5% (or 9,300 persons) to 1,708,183 people.
- Nationally, the ERP increased 1.4% to 24,127,159 people.

## Further Analysis

South Australia's population rose by 0.1% during the June quarter 2016, to be 0.5% higher than a year ago. Nationally, population rose by 0.3% in the June quarter 2016 and was 1.4% higher than a year earlier—see Chart 1.



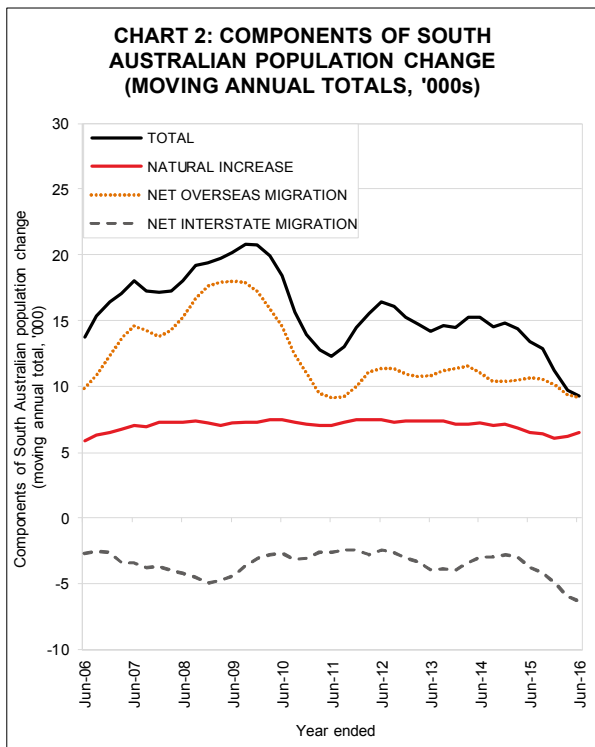
Population growth over the year by state, from highest to lowest was: Victoria (2.1%), New South Wales and Queensland (1.4%), the ACT (1.3%), Western Australia (1.0%), South Australia and Tasmania (both up 0.5%) and the Northern Territory (0.2%).

In the 12 months to June 2016 the largest contribution to South Australia's population growth came from net overseas migration, which totalled 9,200 persons, down 14% from the previous 12 months. Natural increase over the period totalled 6,500, up 0.4% from the previous 12 months. In the year to June 2016, there was a net interstate outflow of 6,400 people from South Australia, 70% higher than in the previous 12 months—see Chart 2.
