RETAIL TRADE, MAY 2016

Summary

During May, nominal retail turnover:

- rose 0.3% in South Australia in <u>trend</u> terms (nationally, nominal retail turnover rose 0.2%); and
- rose 0.3% in South Australia in seasonally adjusted terms (nationally, nominal retail turnover rose 0.2%).

Note: Retail turnover in current prices incorporates changes in both prices and sales volumes.

Further Analysis

Trend

All states recorded an increase in retail turnover in May except Queensland, which recorded a fall of 0.2%.

Compared with a year earlier, nominal retail turnover was 3.6% higher in South Australia and 3.3% higher nationally (see Table 1, Chart 1 and 2).

Through the year to May 2016, increases in South Australian retail turnover were recorded for Cafes, Restaurants and Take Away Food Services (up 12%), 'Other' Retailing (up 5.4%), Clothing, Footwear and Personal Accessory Retailing (up 4.3%), Food Retailing (up 2.5%) and Department Stores (up 1.2%). A fall was recorded in Household Goods Retailing (down 0.5%)—(see Chart 3 for contributions to growth).


Seasonally adjusted


During May, increases in nominal turnover were recorded in New South Wales (up 0.7%), Victoria (up 0.6%) and South Australia (up 0.3%). Falls were recorded in Western Australia (down 0.7%) and Queensland (down 0.4%) while turnover was unchanged in the month in Tasmania.


Compared with a year earlier, nominal retail turnover was 3.8% higher in South Australia and 3.4% higher nationally.
