



2019 RUBY AWARDS

Nomination Guideline: Geoff Crowhurst Memorial Award

Named in honour of South Australian theatre director Geoff Crowhurst, this award recognises individual contribution to community arts and cultural development.

This encompasses creative collaborations between the arts and cultural sector and communities on their own ground, working to achieve artistic and social outcomes.

A community may be defined by a uniting factor, such as geographic location, cultural background, religious belief, gender or disability, or it could be an online community.

The award is open to:

- Arts and cultural sector workers
- Community workers
- Local and State Government workers
- Not-for-profit sector workers
- Private enterprise workers
- Professional artists
- Volunteers.

Award criteria

- Nominees must have demonstrated credibility through involvement in arts and cultural projects that build stronger, more cohesive communities.
- Nominees must reside or be based in South Australia OR have been a resident or based in South Australia during a period of major professional achievement or development.
- Previous winners in this category are ineligible.

Important information

Previously unsuccessful nominees are encouraged to resubmit.

Nominations can be made in more than one category, but separate nominations must be submitted.

Nominations must be accompanied by a signed acknowledgement and acceptance of nomination form by the nominee.

There is no shortlist and no announcement will be made about the recipient of this award prior to the presentation event.

By entering the Ruby Awards you are giving Arts South Australia the right to use your application material for awards-related promotional purposes including display and publicity.

All nominees are required to be available for a range of promotional activities including media interviews, photo and filming opportunities and attendance at the presentation event.

The Ruby Awards judges reserve the right to move a nomination into another category if deemed more appropriate.

The judges' decision is final and no further discussion will be entered into. Arts South Australia will not provide feedback to unsuccessful nominations.

Invitations will be issued to all finalists to attend the presentation event on **Friday 29 November 2019** at the Queen's Theatre.

Closing date

The nomination must be completed and submitted with any support material no later than **5PM TUESDAY 8 OCTOBER 2019**.

Nominations received after the closing date will NOT be accepted.
